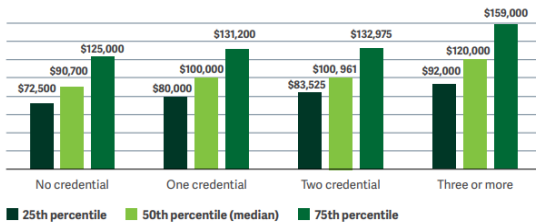

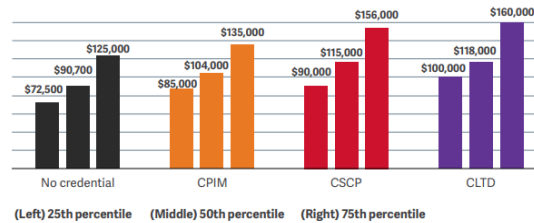
The Certification Advantage and Upskilling as Catalysts for Growth

Earning an APICS certification provides a significant financial advantage, with credentialed professionals enjoying a 20% median salary increase over those without one. This premium remains consistent across all stages of a career, offering a 4% edge even when compared to other supply-chain-specific designations. While the CPIM and CSCP provide substantial boosts of 15% and 27% respectively, the CLTD leads the way with a 30% increase, driven in part by the deep expertise of its more experienced cohort.

Impact of APICS Certifications on Earning Potential



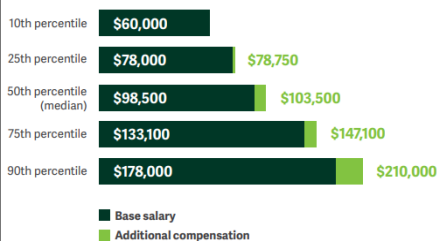
Salary Premium for APICS-Certified Supply Chain Degree Holders



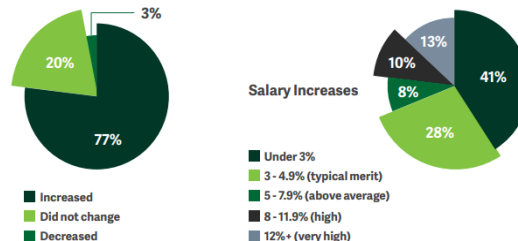
U.S. Supply Chain Salaries Reach New Milestones

The 2026 data reflects a resilient and growing market for U.S. supply chain professionals, as base salaries alone reached a new median of \$98,500 and median total compensation packages climbed to \$103,500. Stability remains a hallmark of the field, with 77% of professionals reporting a salary increase — a figure that continues to hold steady despite broader economic fluctuations. While cost-of-living adjustments of at least 3% provided a baseline for most, very substantial financial gains were experienced by those who either moved to a new company (61%) or were promoted internally (38%), reinforcing the significant premium placed on strategic career advancement and proven expertise.

Be sure to check out our upcoming **Sales & Operations Planning** course if you or your organization could use a refresher on S&OP processes or it is your first time learning about the benefits of S&OP.

If you are enrolling in a certification preparation course, remember that the **ASCM Certification Upgrade membership** is required for course and exam-related discounts.

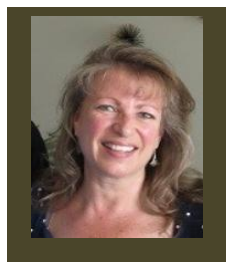

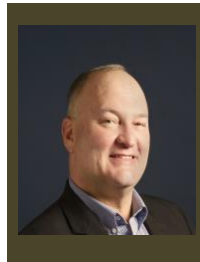

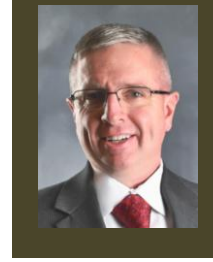

There are 3 things that many organizations will support for your professional development which are worth requesting funds for:

1. **Annual membership dues** – many organizations will cover or reimburse professional society dues for organizations that are relevant to your job duties.
2. **Training** – if you wish to get an ASCM certification to improve your abilities at work, this is the time to ask that money be put in the budget to cover it, even if you think you may not take the training until the last part of 2027. 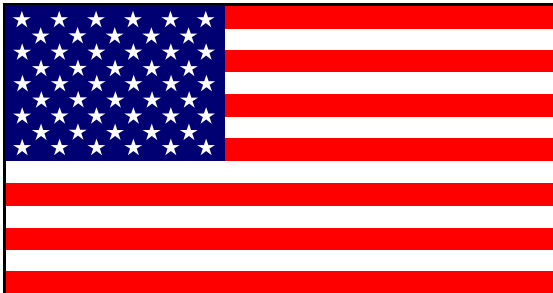
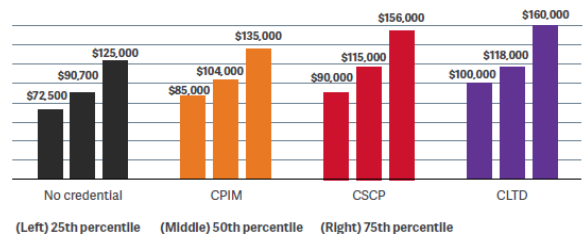
